From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Christ Lutheran Families,

Receive my heartfelt greetings in the precious name of our High priest — Jesus Christ! I know some of you are geographically far from the church and some of you, because of health issues, couldn't join us in person during our regular services. However, we thank God that most of you have been watching online. Today in this newsletter, I want to share with you the disciples on the Emmaus Road.

Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. 14 They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. 15 As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; 16 but they were kept from recognizing him. Luke 24:13-16 (NIV)

So, these two friends were walking home from Jerusalem to the village of Emmaus. It's about 7 miles from Jerusalem, or 10 kilometers. They were in a desperate situation, disappointed and left without hope. When Jesus died, they saw him, and they were quite sure that all their hope was destroyed. What we sense from the conversation they had is that nobody could have convinced them to turn back to Jerusalem.

The last time they saw Jesus, He was dead. He was gone. They thought he was never coming back. They'd made it through the last couple days, but were sad and depressed. Then they heard word from several women who followed Jesus that his body wasn't in the tomb and that angels had appeared to them saying Jesus was alive. They didn't believe it and just felt more confusion and darkness. They'd come to Jerusalem for the Passover feast and now it was time for them to go home.

What had happened Easter morning was something extraordinary. The light of the resurrection had already started to shine over the on darkness of Jerusalem. Peter and the other disciples, including Mary and Mary Magdalene, had already tested the joy and some of them had already met Jesus- the resurrected Lord. But in the midst of all these dramatic events, there were Emmaus disciples who were living in their own world and hadn't seen or understood what had happened in the spiritual world.

How about when you look for God but can't sense his presence? We look for him, and we're told by our pastors and more spiritual friends the "he is right there!" but we just can't see him for ourselves. Instead of sensing God, you feel like he's gone or like he'll talk to anyone but you. When you can't see God or sense Christ's presence, what should you do? That's a dark place to be at but it's similar to where some of Jesus' followers found themselves Sunday after his crucifixion. Resurrection is hidden from their sight. Where there is no message of resurrection, there is no hope, there is no future, no vision, and life is meaningless! I just want to share this as a challenge to each and every one of us who should be responsible to spread the news of the resurrection to those who still do not know that Jesus conquered death and was resurrected for our righteousness. They need to hear, they need to be back to meet him. As we prepare to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus, let us pray for those who are on Emmaus Road (the road that leads us astray from the resurrection news) so that they may come back to the empty tomb and be witnesses of the resurrection. May God bless you & keep you safe!

Daily Bread Pantry

March has arrived! Many people are struggling to be patient for the awakening of spring, the blooming flowers, an increase in temperatures and daylight. At the same time, we tend to forget that someone else is experiencing tougher times than ourselves.

Every other month, several Macomb County with financial woes visit the Daily Bread Food Pantry. They struggle with a low-fixed income, are without work, or have special needs, leading to financial woes. This pantry has also received requests from people who used to get help from another church which shut down last spring. But one common challenge is how to survive on social security, alone, when experiencing ever – increasing daily expenses.

On January 21, most local pantries were closed due to Polar vortex and frigid temperatures. The windchills were about 15 to 20 degrees below zero. However, four pantry volunteers from Christ Lutheran came fully prepared in several layers of clothing. In all, some 37 vehicles, about 90 individuals, were served in one hour. Some extra boxes were quickly assembled by a volunteer as more people showed up than the actual estimate. Despite the church office being closed for day, Pastor Hunde came to assist, and shared dialogues with visitors, They smiled with comments on how surprised they were to be able to come and receive food items. Indeed, this was an extra special day, because all volunteers were thankful that God provided the lifetime essentials, giving volunteers comfort and warmth, along with the ability to serve when other places cancelled the opportunity. A special thank you to the volunteers who served on that dangerous, bitterly cold day.

With Lent and Easter upon us, let's take the time every day to give Him thanks for all the ways that God blesses us from having a roof over our head, a church to share worship, and food on the table. May you and your loved ones be blessed this Easter.



Zacchaeus




